

FROM CDC WEBSITE – WHAT IS “UP-TO-DATE”

MODERNA OR PFIZER

Primary Series:

2 doses of Moderna given 4–8 weeks apart or 2 Doses of Pfizer given 3-8 weeks apart

Fully Vaccinated: 2 weeks after final dose in primary series

Boosters:

1 booster, preferably of either Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine

- For most people at least 5 months after the final dose in the primary series

2nd booster of either Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is at least 4

months after the 1st booster for adults ages 50 years and older and/or immunocompromised

Up to Date: Immediately after getting all boosters recommended for you.

- People ages 18 through 49 years can choose to get a 2nd booster of either Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at least 4 months after their 1st booster. The 2nd booster is not required to be considered up to date for people ages 18 through 49 years.

JOHNSON & JOHNSON (J&J)

Primary Series:

1 dose of Johnson & Johnson's

Fully Vaccinated: 2 weeks after vaccination

Boosters:

1 booster, of J&J or preferably of either Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine

- For most people at least 2 months after a J&J COVID-19 vaccine

2nd booster of either Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is at least 4

months after the 1st booster for adults ages 50 years and older and/or immunocompromised.

Up to Date: Immediately after getting all boosters recommended for you.

- People ages 18 through 49 years who received a J&J COVID-19 vaccine for both their primary dose and booster can choose to get a 2nd booster of either Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at least 4 months after their 1st booster. The 2nd booster is not required to be considered up to date for people ages 18 through 49 years who got a J&J COVID-19 vaccine for both their primary dose and 1st booster.
